In an Oscar-nominated role, Pitt stars in director David Fincher's adaptation of F. Scott Fitzgerald's tale about a man who is born in his 80s and ages backwards. Set in New Orleans from the First World War until Hurricane Katrina, his remarkable story is recounted via the diary of his lifelong friend, Daisy (Blanchett). 00000

Designing Women: The Complete First Season

STARS: Dixie Carter, Delta Burke, Annie Potts, Jean Smart

Debuting in 1986, the seven-season sitcom featured strong-willed Southern belles operating an interior design company. Suzanne (Burke) is a serial bride, wealthy from alimony; sister Julia (Carter) has the business smarts; Mary Jo (Potts) is a divorced single mom; Charlene (Smart) is naïve but, like the others, dedicated to the cause. 00000

Crusoe: The Complete Series

STARS: Philip Winchester, Tongai Arnold Chirisa, Anna Walton, Sam Neill In this 13-episode drama loosely based on Daniel Defoe's 1719 novel, Crusoe (Winchester) is stranded on a desert isle. He befriends Friday (Chirisa), a native who asserts that he is not a slave. The pair encounters pirates looking for buried treasure, as well as members of Friday's former tribe, all of whom make life somewhat uncomfortable. 00000



Last Chance Harvey

STARS: Dustin Hoffman, Emma Thompson, Kathy Baker

Harvey (Hoffman) is a jazz pianist stuck in a jingle-writing job. Leaving New York for his daughter's wedding in London, he discovers she wants her stepfather to lead her down the aisle. Missing his plane home, he drinks heavily in the airport bar where he meets Kate (Thompson), and his life immediately takes a new turn in this grown-up romantic comedy. 20000 =

The Soundstage Sessions This 10-song set (including Dave Matthews' "Crash Into Me" and
